

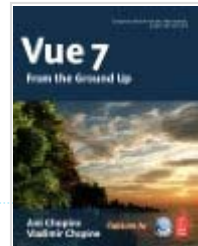

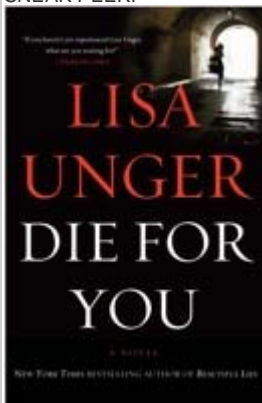

Chapter 1, "The Interface" begins by giving an overview of how the *Vue* interface is laid out and to give you a basic understanding of what tools are available and how they can work for you. It also goes over some of the terms that are used in the rest of the book.

Chapter 2, "The World" describes to you the world of *Vue*. There are four views to your world, but you must keep in mind that even though the world is truly infinite, this can come at a price, since at some point that 3D world must be rendered into a 2D space and that can take

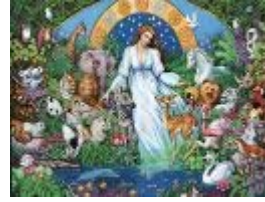
